

Historic Hollywood Cemetery Walking Tour

THURSDAY, JUNE 18 (9-11AM)

Hollywood Cemetery is a place of history, a place of beauty, and a place with an elaborate out art museum. Although many visitors come to see the resting spots of presidents or have an interest in Civil War history, Hollywood contains some of the finest examples of native trees and historic roses in the Commonwealth. There are over 2,000 trees in the cemetery today; some of which predate the cemetery. There is also a vast collection of heritage roses; over 100 of these have been identified.

Designed in the rural garden style, Hollywood Cemetery is one of three cemeteries in the U.S. which has two presidents. It is also the final resting place of President of the Confederacy, Jefferson Davis and members of his immediate family including his son Billy who was Hard-of-Hearing. The Davis family has a connection to renowned deaf artist John Carlin who painted a portrait of Davis' son.
